FPNA FOOD AND CLOTHING DRIVE

It is time to give back. I've written previously about FPNA volunteer efforts and now we are continuing with these endeavors. This is one that every single resident of our neighborhood can help with. We are going to have a food and clothing drive for the Care and Share houses located at 1808 5th Avenue and 600 South Main Street.

The Care and Share house is a volunteer-based organization, operated by the Fifth Avenue Methodist Church, that provides food and clothing to the people of Council Bluffs and surrounding communities. They accept food and clothing donations to be redistributed to those in need.

Care and Share delivers food orders on a monthly basis to residents at local subsidized apartment units like Regal Towers, Plainview Apartments, and Bluffs Towers. They collect the pantry orders and distribute the food on site to assist those who do not have access to transportation.

With next month's June edition of the Fairmount Press Newsletter we will include a plastic grocery bag. The goal is to have everyone fill that bag with unused non-perishable food items, non-food items and clothing that is in good condition. We will have two designated pick up days Saturday June 14th and Saturday June 21st.

We would request that everyone donating items place the filled plastic grocery bags on their front porch so that it is easily viewable from the street before 11:00 a.m that morning. FPNA volunteers will then make the rounds throughout the neighborhood to collect the filled plastic grocery bags. We will then deliver the donated items to the Care and Share House to help stock their shelves.

This gesture is a small way to thank the United Methodist Church for the continued, tireless work they do for our community and as a personal thank you from the FPNA.

As president of the FPNA I urge everyone reading this article to take note, to mark your calendars and as you are doing your weekly grocery shopping or clearing out your pantry or closet to consider that there is always someone right here within our community that needs a helping hand. Together, we each can make that small commitment to fill that plastic grocery bag with unused non-perishable food items, non-food items and clothing that is in good condition. This is our opportunity to give back to our neighborhood and our community.


y article is short this month as I spoke about the FPNA Food and Clothing Drive on the front page. I have a few more topics to communicate.

MEMBERSHIP MEETING UPDATES

Our shake-up of meeting locations continued last Saturday with our May meeting at Barley's. The meeting space was ideal and Barley's furnished the tea, lemonade, water and the chicken and beef wraps, so we were well supplied with food and drink. What was missing was a large turnout of the folks, although a couple of members who don't usually attend were there. Our plan is to hold our meetings at different times and places so that everyone who wishes to attend can do so at least part of the time. Kyle gave a comprehensive report of what's going on; it will be a busy month.

Meanwhile, plans are going forward to hold our next meeting in conjunction with the "Grand Opening of Kirn Park" as soon as the artist's signs are completed. The artist is working on the sign on High School—honest, he is as he's been seen there. We are not complaining because, compared to some of the artists' signs at other City parks, our signs have made great progress. This grand opening event will be held at the end of June, if all goes well, and the Parks Department and the Gibraltar NA will participate. It will be a memorable event, one not to miss.

POLES

When you go outside to pick up this newsletter, you may see the final four poles installed, with banners flying. The footings have been poured by our professional team of installers (Dave, Kyle and Mike). They are the ones who will hoist up the poles, which are presently being stored at 134 Park (in the living room of that house undergoing renovation) thanks to the kind cooperation of homeowners Dave and John. These final four poles are the last of this years-long project.

FLOWER BASKETS

Last year, our flower baskets were planted by Sherbondy's, but this year we decided that we should be responsible for our own planting. This is the cost effective way to do it, and Michelle, our resident horticulturalist, was tasked with the job. She started the sweet potato vine cuttings donated by Linda, but some of them didn't survive our unusually cold winter. More cuttings have started from the remaining vines and are well underway. Wave petunias are planned to fill out the baskets. While we've gotten off to a slow start, the 18 baskets (16 for poles plus 2 in reserve) will be ready for hanging in the near future.

As we all know, the cost of the pole project has depleted our treasury and we are doing our best to keep expenditures to a bare minimum until we built it up again. It has been proposed that we call for members to sponsor a basket for the season and have estimated that \$20 per basket will help pay for the costs of soil, fertilizer and plants. This does not mean that we're asking for people to *maintain* the baskets, only to help the NA *pay* for the baskets. All the work will be done by our volunteers, the way it's always been done.

Won't you step forward and contribute something for flower basket maintenance? Even if it isn't the \$20 mentioned, anything will be appreciated.

LOOKOUT POINT 2014 CLEAN-UP





Free Smoke Detector Program

Every year there are over 3,000 deaths and 30,000 injuries in the United States due to fire in homes. The best way to lower those numbers is to make sure every home has at least two working smoke detectors, one located near the sleeping area of the home. The Council Bluffs Fire Department is urging you to check your smoke detectors. If it's more than ten years old, or doesn't work, please replace it as quickly as possible. If you need a smoke detector, or just need to have the battery replaced, contact the Council Bluffs Fire Department by calling, 712-328-4646. There is no charge for the detectors or service. Smoke detectors for hearing impaired persons are also available.
